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Derryoober National School Stay Safe Policy

1. Introduction

This policy was developed in line with current Child Protection Guidelines & Procedures (DES 2017) and Children First (TUSLA 2017), ensuring the protection and safety of all students. The Stay Safe Programme is a primary school-based child abuse prevention and personal safety programme designed to empower children with the skills and knowledge to recognise, resist, and report unsafe situations.

Derryoober National School is committed to the well-being, personal safety, and protection of all students. This programme aims to equip children with the necessary skills to identify risks, manage unsafe situations, and seek help when needed. The Stay Safe Programme is a vital part of our Social, Personal, and Health Education (SPHE) curriculum.

2. Aims of the Stay Safe Programme

- To reduce children's vulnerability to abuse and bullying.
- To teach children personal safety strategies.
- To enable children to seek help confidently.
- To promote positive mental health, self-esteem, and resilience.
- To develop children's ability to recognise, resist, and report unsafe situations.
- To reinforce safe and respectful interactions among students.

3. Implementation of the Stay Safe Programme

- The Stay Safe Programme is delivered as part of the **SPHE curriculum**.
- It is taught every second year from Junior Infants to Sixth Class.
- Lessons focus on bullying, personal boundaries, online safety, and safe relationships.
- The programme is adapted to be age-appropriate and developmentally suitable.
- Teachers may **revisit certain topics** if needed to address specific concerns.
- Staff training and parental involvement are essential to its success.

4. Parental Involvement & Collaboration

- Parents are informed in advance about the **Stay Safe Programme**.
- Parents are encouraged to discuss lessons at home and support children's learning.
- Information about the **programme content** is available at <u>www.pdst.ie/staysafe</u>.
- If a parent chooses to **withdraw their child**, a written record of their reasons will be kept.
- Open communication between **parents**, **staff**, **and the Board of Management** is encouraged.

5. Core Topics in the Stay Safe Programme

Junior & Senior Infants

- Identifying safe and unsafe feelings.
- Understanding personal space and boundaries.
- Friendships and social interactions.
- Knowing my name, address, and phone number.
- Learning to say NO to unsafe situations.

1st & 2nd Class

- Recognising bullying and unsafe behaviours.
- Learning the importance of telling a trusted adult.
- Understanding secrets good secrets vs. bad secrets.
- Safe relationships and peer support.

3rd & 4th Class

- Dealing with bullying and peer pressure.
- Understanding personal safety and body privacy.
- Responding to threats and inappropriate situations.
- Online safety and responsible internet use.

5th & 6th Class

- Personal rights and responsibilities.
- Dealing with social pressures and unsafe requests.
- Understanding personal boundaries and consent.
- Recognising grooming, inappropriate online contact, and harmful interactions.

6. Delivery Methods

The Stay Safe Programme is delivered using interactive and engaging teaching methodologies, including:

- Role play and scenario-based learning.
- Group discussions and circle time.
- Art-based expression and storytelling.
- Use of videos and digital resources.

Real-life case studies and examples.

7. Resources Used

The Stay Safe Programme utilises the following resources:

- Teacher manuals and lesson plans.
- Parental guidance booklets.
- Classroom worksheets and digital activities.
- Videos and educational animations.
- SPHE-integrated lesson materials.

8. Supervision & Safeguarding

- All staff involved in the delivery of the **Stay Safe Programme** receive **ongoing training**.
- The **Designated Liaison Person (DLP) and Deputy DLP** oversee child protection concerns.
- All staff follow mandatory reporting procedures in line with Children First Guidelines.
- Lessons are conducted in a safe and supportive environment.

9. Monitoring & Review

- The Stay Safe Programme is reviewed annually by the Board of Management.
- Staff and parents are invited to provide feedback on its effectiveness.
- Updates are made to ensure **compliance with best practices and legal** requirements.
- Children's understanding is assessed to **ensure the programme's effectiveness**.
